

Dr. Ellen Deibert

Dr. Ellen Deibert is a board certified and fellowship-trained neurologist. Dr. Deibert received her medical degree from the Temple University School of Medicine and completed her residency training at Johns Hopkins Hospital, where she served as Chief Resident in Neurology. She completed fellowships in Neurological Intensive Care and Neurorehabilitation at Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis. She served on the faculty of Washington University School of Medicine in the Departments of Neurology and Neurosurgery until 2003. At that point she joined the Department of Medicine, division of Neurology, at Berkshire Medical Center located in Pittsfield Massachusetts. In 2007, Dr. Deibert started the BHS Comprehensive Brain Injury Program which focused on the care and needs of brain injury survivors. In addition, that same year, she developed the Concussion Clinic at BMC which focused specifically on patients suffering from concussions from sports related injuries. During this period, BHS and Dr. Deibert started the BHS ImPACT Community Project which is encouraging baseline cognitive testing in local public high schools for athletes in high collision sports. More recently she became a Certified Brain Injury Specialist Trainer and trained 7 employees at BMC to become Certified Brain Injury Specialists. She also serves on the Board of Governors for the Academy of Brain Injury Specialists, is a Clinical ImPACT Consultant, and is on the Board of Directors for the BIA-MA. In October 2010, Dr. Deibert established Berkshire Brain Injury & Neurological Services, PC which is a new private practice with a focus on traumatic and acquired brain injury survivors. The move to private practice was to allow future work within the community in the areas of concussion and traumatic brain injury as well as expanding the practice to underserved areas. More recently, she is acquired her Connecticut Medical License and will be opening a concussion clinic in Sharon, CT one day a month. Dr. Deibert's future goals include working extensively with brain injury survivors in her local community and also help design traumatic brain injury programs for other rural communities.
